Listening for the Promise

Weekly Devotional

Fourth Sunday of Advent – December 18, 2022

"Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel." - Isaiah 7:14-

Jesus Christ comes to us in the flesh. This is third way that Christ comes to us: through his advent, his arrival, as human being in the flesh. Of course, this is what we celebrate at Christmas. It's the heart, the reason, and the foundation of why we celebrate Christmas as Christians. Jesus' arrival as a human being was foretold centuries before when the prophet Isaiah prophesied this words from our verse above.

At the time that these words of Isaiah were spoken, there was a war going on in the Southern Kingdom of Judah. Syria and Israel (the Northern Kingdom) had joined forces to attack Judah. King Ahaz was afraid Judah would be overtaken. So God spoke to Isaiah and told him to reassure Ahaz. God offered to do a miracle so Ahaz could witness it and be assured that he wouldn't lose. Unbelieveably, the king refused. Though Ahaz was one of Jesus' ancestors, he was an evil king. He had no desire or interest in following God.

God was not happy about this. So God chose the miracle himself. He told Isaiah about this miracle, and Isaiah announced it to Ahaz: Well, that didn't make God happy. And so He picked the miracle himself and announced it through Isaiah: "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel" (v. 14).

King Ahaz ignored God's promise. Instead, the king went his own direction, an evil direction. But God's promise wasn't just that a young woman would have a baby, Judah would be saved, and everyone would live happily ever after, the end. This promise was much deeper than that. This infant would be born to a virgin. He would Immanuel - "God with us." This infant would grow into a man. He would save us from much bigger enemies than King Ahaz was dealing with. Yes, Jesus would save us from the power of death, sin, and the devil through his life, his innocent suffering and death, and his resurrection from the tomb.

Prayer: Gracious God, we thank you for coming to us in the flesh, to live among your people as Immanuel, "God with us." In Jesus' name. Amen

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
