



Listening for the Promise

Weekly Devotional

Fourth Sunday of Easter – April 30, 2023

"Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I shall fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.."

-Psalm 23:4-

As I have grown in years, I find that I see Scripture in new light. Psalm 23 is no exception. It does not deny the fact that as believers and defenders of God's Word, we will indeed endure trial and hardship. Notice that the psalmist does not write: "If I should possibly walk through the darkest valley..." No, he writes, "Though I walk through the darkest valley..." It is not a matter of if we will endure trials and harships, it's simply a matter of when we do. And when we do, then what? Well, we have no reason to be afraid, do we? And that's because we have our Good Shepherd there to guide us through, comforting us with his promise of life and salvation.

Some years ago we had a terrible storm go through our area where we lived in South Dakota at the time. Our youngest wasn't born yet, so we had a six-year-old and two-year-old at home. The power went out and everything was pitch black! My husband found some little tea-light candles. When he got the first one lit, our six-year-old son exclaimed with excitement, "Wow! I can see the whole hallway!" He was right. Just the tiniest flame from a tea-light was able to enlighten the entire pitch black hallway, bringing much comfort to our little ones.

One of the benefits of traveling through darkness is appreciating the brilliant light whenever it arrives. We sinful humans are all too quick to forget our Lord's blessings. Until... until whatever challenge or hardship comes our way. Then we remember how uncomfortable and scary the darkness can be. We cry out to God to calm our fears and help us through. He seems so far away, and yet, he is never far from us. God promises to never leave us nor forsake us. If God says it, it's true. We must trust in his promises for us. When we do, we find that even when the scary darkness comes upon us, our Good Shepherd is there, ready to help us through, guiding us toward the light once again.

Prayer: Gracious and loving God, thank you for always being with us. Forgive us when we lose sight of the power of your Light and your promise to keep us safe and close to you always. Help us to keep our eyes upon you. In Jesus' name, amen.
