





Listening for the Promise

Weekly Devotional

Seventh Sunday of Easter – May 21, 2023

"And I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one." -John 17:11-

This is one of those chapters of the Bible that gets tucked away and easily overlooked. And it's such a special chapter in Holy Scripture. The Gospel of St. John, chapter 17 is known as "Jesus' High Priestly Prayer." Here, within the pages of God's Word, we can tenderly hold in our own hands the very words of Jesus' prayer for us.

Let's take a look at the setting for this most precious prayer. The time has arrived for Jesus' time on earth to come to an end. He has about an hour, maybe two, before he will be arrested for a crime he did not commit. Jesus will be beaten so badly, it will be difficult to recognize him as a human being. He will be crucified (a criminal's death) for a crime he's innocent of. He will hang in great agony, stripped of his clothing and dignity for all to see. He will be mocked, despised, and rejected. And he knows he has mere hours before all this must take place. So what does Jesus do? He prays. Not only for himself, but he prays for his followers, for you and me. Can we take a moment to try to take this in? If this had been you or me, I'm certain that praying for others would not be at the top of our list. We'd probably be in a state of panic and fear at the very least. But not Jesus.

Jesus prayed that his Father would keep us safe, that we would not be forgotten. He prayed that we would be unified in him. Jesus could have prayed privately or in the quietness of his heart. But he wanted us to hear his prayer for us, to know that we are safe- that God holds us in the hollow of his hands. Furthermore, Jesus is sending us out into the world as his witnesses. As Jesus said, "These things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves" (see v. 13). You are not forgotten. Just as Christ died for you and rose again for you, so he also made plans for you—that you would be safe from Satan, and grow in God's care until you reach the fullness of joy He has planned for you and all His people.

Prayer: Gracious and loving God, thank you for your protection. May we trust in you always. In Jesus' name, amen.
