

Listening for the Promise

Weekly Devotional

Fourth Sunday After Pentecost – June 25, 2023

"Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not, therefore, you are of more value than many sparrows." -Matthew 10:29-31 -

Because God is omniscient (all-knowing), he is aware of everything in minute detail. Although God is exalted above the heavens, he notices even the little things that we dismiss as trivial. We wonder why God notices the falling of each sparrow or why he numbers the hairs of our heads. On one level this shows us how awesome God's knowledge is. But to stop here is to miss the point of the passage and to reduce God's knowledge to a game of trivial pursuit.

The point of the passage is that God's knowledge is purposeful, not trivial. And if God knows even the little things, how much more does he know and care for those who are created in his image, redeemed by his Son, and sent by his Spirit into his mission. From the broader context, we see that Jesus offers these words to comfort those who face violent persecution from family, friends, and civil government. The point is this: We are not to fear, even in the midst of violent persecution, since the all-knowing God sees us and has our back.

But God doesn't just see us. He also sees our situation and knows how it fits into His missionary plan. Since God's knowledge is purposeful, not trivial, he makes "all things work together for good for those who are called according to his purpose (Rom. 8:28)," even bad things. And this is so only because God makes all things work together for the accomplishment of his plan! Thus, in the midst of persecution, we can take comfort in two things: 1) God will save us, and 2) God will also accomplish his plan. The mission is God's, not ours, and he will see it through.

On this last point, consider verses 1 and 4 from the hymn "Once to Every Man and Nation:" Once to every man and nation. Comes the moment to decide. In the strife of truth with falsehood. For the good or evil side. Some great cause, some great decision. Offering each the bloom or blight. And the choice goes by forever. Twixt that darkness and that light.

Though the cause of evil prosper. Yet 'tis truth alone is strong. Though her portion be the scaffold. And upon the throne be wrong. Yet that scaffold sways the future. And behind the dim unknown. Standeth God within the shadow. Keeping watch above His own.
