## Listening for the Promise Weekly Devotional

#### Ninth Sunday after Pentecost—July 30, 2023

"Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls, who, on finding one pearl of great value, went and sold all that he had and bought it." -Matthew 13:45-46-

Our text tells us that God's Kingdom is the pearl of great price. It is so valuable that it is worth giving up everything to attain it, including our lives. But how valuable is it? Our text does not answer this question because it cannot. Although the Kingdom is more valuable than all we have, we cannot put a price tag on it since it transcends all human values. More basically, its value cannot be measured since the Kingdom is itself the measure of all values.

So, what exactly is the Kingdom? Simply put, the Kingdom is the reign of God. In his Small Catechism, Luther states this truth quite plainly in his explanation of the Second Petition of The Lord's Prayer. Luther tells us that God's Kingdom comes whenever "we believe His holy word and live a godly life." But in this life, we do not yet see the Kingdom in its fullness.

On this side of God's New Creation, the Kingdom is a reign, but not a realm. Thus, we cannot identify the church or any other human institution with the Kingdom. Rather, God's Kingdom comes in all vocational spheres (the family, the workplace, the state, or the church) whenever and wherever people "believe His holy word and live a godly life."

In the New Creation, however, the Kingdom will finally be both a reign and a realm. In fact, it will be a realm precisely because God's reign will become uncontested and all-encompassing. In the New Creation, we will see that God's reign is characterized by peace, joy, love, communion, goodness, beauty, order, meaning, purpose, and everything good.

In the New Creation, we will also see that God's reign extends to the transformation of the entire cosmos and thus to life itself. Death will be no more. From this all-encompassing splendor, we will finally see that Jesus Christ is not merely our personal Lord and Savior, but our cosmic Lord and Savior as well. Yet this transformation will be the special work of the Holy Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead. This same Spirit will quicken our mortal bodies, fill us (and all things) with His glory, and be our intimate friend.

Hence, God's Kingdom is worth giving our lives for, since this Kingdom is literally Life itself.
