# Pastoral Perspectives #2 for September 2023

Grace and peace to you from God the Father of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit amen.

After nearly five years of the Pennsylvania judicial system working on the case against Robert Bowers there is finally some closure for the victims, families, police officers, friends, and community of all those involved. The jury returned with a guilty verdict and to give the death penalty.

In scripture: the word "kill" in the 10 Commandments is much closer, in the original Hebrew, to the word "murder" as found in Book of Exodus 20:2-17 & the Book of Deuteronomy 5:6-21. In the Bible the 5 th Commandment is, "Thou Shall Not Murder". Luther in his Small Catechism wrote, "What does this mean? We are to fear and love God, so that we neither endanger nor harm the lives of our neighbours, but instead help and support them in all of life's needs."

In the Gospel of St. Matthew 5:21 we heard our Lord and Saviour Himself say, "You have heard that it was said to the ancient ones, "You shall not murder;" and "Whoever shall murder shall be in danger of the judgement."

What happened at the Tree of Life Synagogue was a planned anti Semitic/hate crime: not only were parishioners murdered but there was also the attempted murder of the responding police and swat officers on that horrific day.

The jury had a heavy burden to carry in their decision regarding the punishment of such a violent crime that took place in a house of worship. Each juror must live with the fact that the blood of the murderer is on their conscience until the day Bowers is dead one way or the other.

Pennsylvania governors have the power of whether or not to use the death penalty. This too is a decision that the politician must live with for the rest of their life. Our last two governors have chosen not to implement the death penalty. It's easy for us to sit back and judge but what if we are wrong?

In this case of the Tree of Life murders we know that there is no doubt as to whom is guilty. The defense never challenged this but rather looked historically at the life of Bowers to show that there were reasons as to why he committed these murders. It's not always that easy to see with the evidence.

When crimes against humanity take place that shock and sicken us and leave us asking ourselves, "how could such evil exist in humanity?" The answer is in our human history which shows us that sin and evil are everywhere and always have been there since Genesis 4:1-16 with the story of Cain and Abel; this is mankind at its worst! God gave judgement upon Cain for the murder of his brother, "the earth would no longer yield to him any fruit, and he would become a fugitive and a wanderer" (Genesis 4:12).

No matter what punishments we may feel are appropriate: incarceration, solitary confinement, a life sentence, or the death penalty; these punishments are limited to as long as we have breath. In the end it is God who is the final judge and no one on this earth bypasses God on their way their way to heaven or to hell; even if they do not believe in God they will stand before Him and are in for a real wakeup call for God's judgement is eternal!

When we followers of Jesus die, we too will stand before God and God will rightly judge each of us, "on what we have done and left undone" (as we confess each Sunday in church and ask for God's forgiveness in our repentance).

For Bowers, what is even more damning to his soul is that he is not repentant for his actions and behaviours that day and, even while he was wounded, he continued spewing his hatred for a group of people that he had never met nor had ever done anything personally to him. His multiple decisions in planning each detail of this attack and then entering the synagogue, a house of worship, to murder innocent people is not mental illness but pure evil.

Houses of worship globally have suffered more and more attacks in recent years that reach into the thousands! In the first quarter of 2023 there have been 289 attacks, or incidents, on US churches and no doubt this will continue.

This may remind us of Luther's famous hymn A Mighty Fortress Hymn # 505 ELW "Though hordes of devils fill the land, all threatening to devour us."

However, it is more important that we remember the final verse of the hymn, "They cannot win the day. The kingdom's our FOREVER!"

May we continue to wake each morning thanking God and praising Him and put on the full armour of God as we are called to by St. Paul in his letter to the Ephesians 6:10-18.
