





Listening for the Promise

Weekly Devotional

First Sunday in Lent— February 18, 2024

“The Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness.”

Mark 1:12 -

A joke to begin Lent: Satan was wandering around, bored out of his gills. The LORD said to Satan, “Go, do your job! Tempt people and make them sin.” Satan answered, “But that’s why I’m so bored. They sin without me and there’s nothing left for me to do!” There’s truth in that joke: we are quite capable of sinning without Satan’s help.

We begin Lent with this story of Jesus going through a process of self-discovery and preparation. It actually began when Jesus heard His Father’s voice confirm His identity at His baptism. He was then immediately led out into the wilderness to reflect on who He was and what He had to do. For forty days He was tempted by Satan. Jesus faced possibilities, the twisted expectations of Satan and the world. When the time of preparation was over, Jesus left the wilderness and began His work, strengthened, encouraged, and assured to follow the path God established for Him. In His wilderness journey, Jesus recognized His identity, reflected on His purpose and was then able to put it to work.

Satan is no joke, but Lent is a time for us to be reminded that we are constantly tempted away from God’s will. Today we are invited to set out with Jesus into our own wilderness, to discover who we are and to reflect upon our purpose. We tend to jump into action, both as individuals and as congregations, without really knowing what God intends for us. We fall for the twisted expectations of Satan and the world. How much better would it be if we followed Jesus, trusting in God as He reveals to us our own identity as children of God? Then we can go out with confidence and assurance, and do the work we have been called to do.

Jesus began and ended His ministry alone. The responsibility for the salvation of humankind rested on His shoulders alone; no one could share the weight of that burden. Jesus faced His wilderness temptations alone, but we don’t have to. Our Savior walks with us, He helps us, He gives us what we need. Our Lenten journey is not a test we must pass; the testing in the wilderness is that which builds faith, strength, courage, and assurance. As we walk with Jesus, He are never alone as we continue His Work in the world.
